

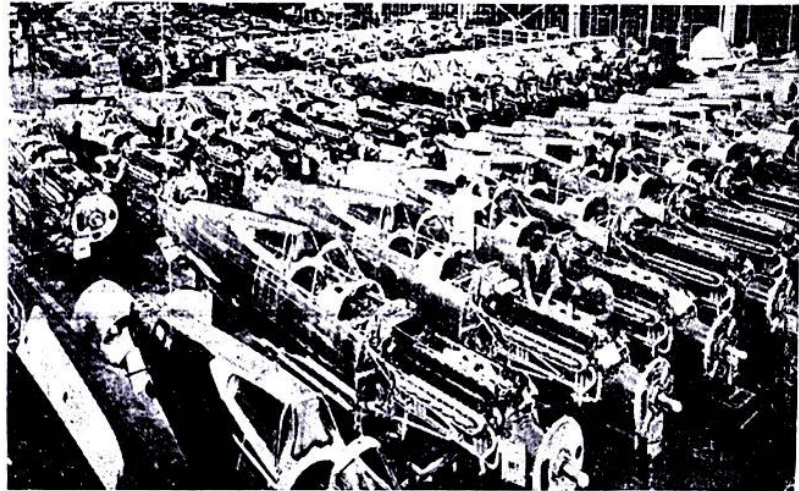

Aluminum Parade Monday Evening

As part of the current drive for old aluminum for national defense a "Hard Times" parade will be held in Fennville, Monday evening July 21, at 7:30. The collection is backed by the Fennville Lions club and taking part will be the Allegan Post of the American Legion, the Boy Scouts, Sheriff Leotis Johnson, and Attorney Harry Bell of Allegan. All civic organizations of the community are invited to participate with the Lions in sponsoring the collection.

The line of march will be from Cozy Corners to town, and a truck will pick up contributions of aluminum, which residents are asked to place at the curb in cartons or other containers. Those outside of the village wishing to contribute are bringing their aluminum to Jackson's Garage.

Fennville Hastens to Buy Defense Bonds

The patriotism and the intensity of feeling with which the people of Fennville and surrounding community received the news of the outbreak of war with Japan was exemplified in the jump of sales of Defense Bonds here.

In the first three days of this week approximately \$15,000 of Defense Bonds was subscribed for, bringing the total sales to \$23,550 of Defense Bonds and \$15,000 of other types of U.S. government bonds, through the Fennville post

office and the Old State Bank so far this year.

The local Defense Bond Committee has established Dec. 1 to Dec. 15 as a period for special efforts to increase the sale of Defense Bonds. Everyone is urged to voluntarily do their part in subscribing for Bonds at this time. The local committee expects the sale of bonds will pass the \$50,000 mark by December 15.

Urges Workers in Defense Jobs To Get Security Numbers

Workers who get employment in defense projects, both in construction and in plant operation, are, in the vast majority of cases covered by the Social Security Act. Such workers will save time and trouble for themselves and their employers by obtaining Social Security account numbers before reporting for duty in their new jobs.

This statement was made by Wm. E. Kirchgessner, manager of the Social Security Board field office in Grand Rapids. Commenting on the necessity of such workers having Social Security account cards he said:

"Many men who are finding jobs on defense projects have been working in non-covered employment or have been self-employed during the time the Social Security Act

has been in operation. There has been no need for such workers to have Social Security numbers, consequently they have not obtained their cards. The same is true of housewives who have not held a job in commerce or industry since January 1, 1937, and who are now finding temporary employment replacing men who are working on defense projects or who have been called for military duty.

"All such workers, and others who do not have Social Security account numbers, should obtain their cards at once, and present the card to the employer so he may record the name and number properly when the new worker first takes up employment. This will save time and trouble for all concerned
